GROUND TRANSPORTATION

From Pittsburgh International Airport

There are several transportation options to bring you to campus and/or to the Wyndham Hotel in Oakland:

- **Uber or Lyft.** These app ride hailing services often provide the best fare from the airport into Pittsburgh proper for a price ranging from \$35-\$60 depending on surge pricing. If you are unfamiliar with the services, there are more traditional services listed below.
- **Taxi service.** The average taxi fare from the airport to campus/hotel is about \$60. There are plenty of taxis outside of the airport near the baggage claim area, but if you need to call a service, call Yellow Cab (412-321-8100) or Classy Cab (412-322-5080).
- **Public Bus Transportation with Port Authority Transit (PAT).** The 28X Airport Flyer bus stops in the heart of the Carnegie Mellon campus and typically takes 45 minutes en route from/to the airport. The trip costs \$3.75 one way and must have exact change. - **Super Shuttle.** Super Shuttle provides shuttle service between the airport and Carnegie Mellon and the Wyndham Hotel. For reservations, contact Super Shuttle at 1-800-258-3826 or at their website – <http://www.supershuttle.com/Locations/PITAirportShuttlePittsburgh.aspx>.

To Pittsburgh International Airport

Unfortunately, taxis are not so plentiful at Carnegie Mellon, and as such, using Uber or Lyft is strongly recommended. We can assist with organizing car sharing for trips to the airport with a car service as well. **If you are interested in using a shared car, Elisabeth Bass Udyawar will help arrange this service given your responses on the registration form.**

Parking on Campus

There are two primary options for parking on campus:

- The first option is to park at the East Campus Garage, which is the building marked as P7 on the campus map.
- The second option is to park on Frew Street. Our meeting location is advantageous for this option, as pay stations on Frew Street allow parking for up to 10 hours. However, the cost of parking on Frew Street can be prohibitive. Parking for a day averages \$16. Pay stations require the driver to enter their license plate number, and accept only credit/debit cards or quarters.

Most other parking spaces on campus only allow for 3 consecutive hours of parking at the same rate, so one would need to visit the pay station every 3 hours to apply for more time.

The 10-hour pay stations on Frew Street are generally available until 8:30AM, so if you arrive for the meeting before then, there are likely to be parking spaces available.

Wyndham Hotel to Carnegie Mellon (Roberts Hall): The distance between the hotel and Roberts Engineering Hall and Baker Hall is walkable at approximately 1 mile – a map is attached with this packet showing the fastest route. Alternatively, the Wyndham runs a shuttle that can take attendees to and from the hotel. Shuttles can be reserved at the front desk of the hotel, or calling the front desk at 412-682-6200.

Directions to Group Dinner at Casbah: (229 S. Highland Ave., Pittsburgh, PA 15206) Meeting participants will be offering carpooling rides from campus to Casbah following the poster session. A map from campus to Casbah has been included with this information packet as well. To return to the Wyndham, a shuttle can be called by phoning the hotel at 412-682-6200 if before 9:30pm. We can arrange for rides or Ubers back to the hotel as well.
