Where and when is SUCCEED?

SUCCEED begins on **Monday**, **July 29**th **and runs through Friday**, **August 2**nd. Every morning, the SUCCEED students will meet in a classroom at Carnegie Mellon University (Porter Hall 125B) and will return to this room for lunches and at the end of the day. If you are picking up and dropping your child, you should pick him or her up and drop him or her off from this room. Campus maps will be provided closer to the start date.

Does SUCCEED provide transportation?

NO – SUCCEED and Carnegie Mellon University do not provide transportation. However, if you are unable to arrange your own transportation, we can supply daily PAT bus tickets and/or transfer tickets to your son or daughter **only if you have requested them ahead of time on the Registration Form**. We cannot change the types of tickets we give your child (Zone 1, Zone 2, and/or transfer tickets) if they differ from your request on the Registration Form. You are responsible for your child's transportation to campus on the first morning.

Does SUCCEED provide lunch?

YES - Lunch will be provided free of charge every day of the program. On the last day of the program, there will be a special celebratory lunch. **On the Registration Form**, you can list any dietary restrictions; however, we are unable to provide special dietary meals; we can offer vegetarian options.

Is there a dress code?

YES - We want your child to be safe, so closed toe shoes are required. Otherwise, we do suggest that your child wears comfortable, casual clothing. The program will require him or her to do some walking around campus and we want him or her to be comfortable. Also, he or she will be conducting hands-on experiments that could cause nice clothes to get dirty. Some of the classrooms will have airconditioning, so he or she may want to bring a sweater/jacket.

Will there be an event for parents/guardians to attend?

YES – On the afternoon of Friday, August 2 students will participate in a debate on subjects discussed throughout the week. Parents/relatives are welcome to attend. You will have a chance to RSVP to this event during the program.

Can my child bring friends, cousins, siblings, or parents?

NO – Except for the event open to parents, participants may not bring extra people to the daily activities.
